


Eye Institute Hosts Sports Vision Training: The Competitive Edge



Dental Institute: Oral Health is Extra Important **During Pregnancy** Anita Chu Fountain, D.D.S., Clinical Assistant Professor



Oral health plays a significant role in your overall health, and no time is more important for great oral health than during pregnancy. Did you know that if you are pregnant, the bacteria in your mouth can be passed to your baby? The cavity-causing bacteria is called Mutans Streptococci (MS), and it metabolizes sugars into acids, leading to demineralization of tooth structure and decay. The good news is

that you can prevent your baby from getting these bacteria by making sure your own mouth is in excellent shape. Make sure to prioritize your oral health—brushing your teeth with fluoridated toothpaste, flossing regularly, and rinsing with an over-the-counter mouth rinse can all help to reduce the bacteria in your mouth. You can also chew gum with Xylitol a few times a day to significantly decrease the mother-child transmission of MS. If you have cavities or tooth pain during pregnancy, you can still get treatment. Your second trimester is the safest time to receive dental care, so book your appointment to ensure a good start for your baby.
